

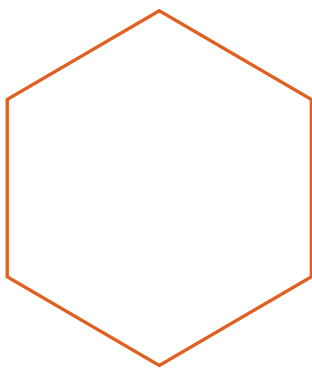
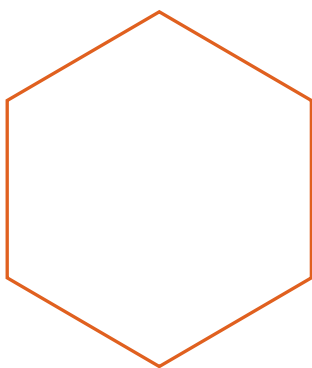
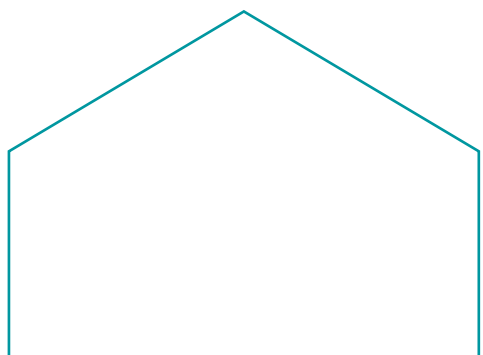

**Always emphasise the

**Tell a story**

Keep your writing clear, using consistent language and short paragraphs. Your reader will want an article that is concise, easy to read that makes a definite point.



## ARTICLE ASSESSMENT

Once a case is heard, a judge gives his/her  
 a hearing to assess the case. He has a set of  
 rules.

A judge will be asked  
 for a finding of  
 fact, such as, did the  
 defendant do the  
 act? If he/she is  
 found guilty, he/she  
 will be sentenced.

## REVISING YOUR ARTICLE

Remember a judge will be asked for a finding of  
 fact, such as, did the defendant do the act?  
 If he/she is found guilty, he/she will be  
 sentenced.

DO	AVOID
Keep a dead end, as far as possible	Let the case be decided
Read each case carefully, and discuss it	Take care to ensure that the judge is satisfied
Make sure the judge is satisfied with the findings of fact	
Remember the judge will be asked for a finding of fact
